FROM THE DESK OF THE VICE-CHANCELLOR, TANUVAS

Dear Readers!

At the outset I extend my Seasons Greetings and Warm Wishes for "A HAPPY, HEALTHY AND PROSPEROUS NEW YEAR AND PONGAL". Let the New Year brings happiness, prosperity, peace and good health to everyone.



It has become habitual for the 'TEAM TANUVAS' to be always in the forefront and I am proud to place on record that in the year 2016, we have made significant and recognizable progress in the frontiers of education, research and extension. In the maiden initiative taken by the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India to rank the universities in our country, TANUVAS stood first among the 12 State Veterinary and Animal Sciences Universities. Further, TANUVAS has been listed under the top 50 universities and bagged 36th rank at National level and 3rd rank at State level. The relatively high position of TANUVAS in various categories of evaluation is a reflection of the continuous efforts to have a quality system for providing instruction, research and

extension in veterinary and animal sciences. In the year 2016, the University introduced Online undergraduate and postgraduate admissions and established a new GLP - Clean Room Laboratory having ISO class 7/8 standards with cleanliness of the order of one cubic foot containing only 10,000 particles, a 'first-of-its-kind' unique facility among academic institutions of India, online knowledge repository on "Diagnostic imaging" and GMP Standard "Stem Cell Research Centre for Animals" and Nano-technology Centre. Under National Agriculture Development Programme (NADP), TANUVAS obtained three new schemes, "Strengthening of diagnostic modalities in Teaching Veterinary Hospitals of Tamil Nadu", "Establishment of Innovation and Instrumentation Centre to fabricate farm equipments / devices for sustainable livestock farming" and "Establishment of Veterinary Forensic Sciences Laboratory" with a total budget of Rs.629.91 lakhs.

Despite getting accolades in academic and scientific fronts, continuous service to the farmers to be the primary objective of TANUVAS. The TANUVAS Foundation day, was celebrated as Livestock and Poultry Farmers Day at Erode by conducting an exhibition showcasing novel low cost technologies and a Farmers Technical Workshop on the theme, "Popularization of novel low cost technological interventions for profitable livestock and poultry farming" on 18.09.2016 to 19.09.2016. More than 6,000 farmers were benefitted. For the benefit of the farmers, the University has released 33 new low cost equipments / devices designed by TANUVAS researchers at University Innovation and Instrumentation Centre (UIIC), ILFC, Madhavaram, Chennai to increase the farm efficiency and profitability and established "Bargur Cattle Research Station" at Bargur, Erode district to conserve the native Bargur cattle, Model Hydroponics Fodder Production Centre at ILFC, Madhavaram, Chennai to introduce and popularize nutritious green fodder production through hydroponics technique, TANUVAS Farm Produce Sales



Outlet at ILFC, Madhavaram, Chennai to motivate farmers towards entrepreneurship and a “Poultry and Livestock Feed Production Unit” at CPPM, Hosur to meet the feed requirements of livestock and poultry.

The veterinary health and clinical services offered at TANUVAS are on par with international standards. To provide emergency and critical medical care to livestock in remote rural areas of Tamil Nadu, Animal Mobile Medical Ambulance (AMMA) service, a first of its kind initiative in the country was started. A new “Avian and Exotic Pet Unit” was also started at the Teaching Veterinary Hospital, MVC to extend the veterinary clinical facilities to the avian and exotic pets like Budgerigars, Cockatiels, Cockatoos, Pigeons, Lovebirds, Hamster, Guinea pigs, etc., and the VUTRC at Madurai has been upgraded to Veterinary University Training and Diagnostic Centre(VUTDC) to provide veterinary diagnostic services also. Further, the ‘Whole genome sequencing’ of *Mycobacterium avium subsp paratuberculosis*, another first of its kind initiative, has been successfully completed which can open up new vistas in the development of high potent new generation vaccines against Johne’s disease.

At the dawn of 2017, I request all the faculty, staff and the stakeholders to join together as ‘TEAM TANUVAS’ to serve the farming community in the best possible way. On behalf of ‘TEAM TANUVAS’, I once again extend my New Year and Pongal wishes and reassure each and every livestock and poultry farmer of Tamil Nadu that it is always ‘FARMER FIRST’ for ‘TEAM TANUVAS’.
