Harikrishnan, Vice-chancellor i/c and Registrar, TANUVAS launched the programme in the presence of Dr. S.R. Rao, Advisor, Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, New Delhi, Dr. K. Kumanan, Director of Research, TANUVAS and Dr.D. Thyagarajan, Dean i/c, Faculty of Basic Sciences, MVC and Director of Distance Education, TANUVAS.

Totally 10 selected candidates are to be trained for 6 months in areas not normally covered under the conventional academic programmes such as Technology management, GLP requirements,



Biosafety, IPR, Regulatory documentation etc. The Department of Biotechnology, Government of India will also provide stipend to the selected candidates. The technology of preparing the collagen based wound healing cream developed at TRPVB was transferred to M/s. Sihil Pharma Companion Health Division, Chennai and a MoU was also exchanged at this function.

ZONAL WORKSHOPS

The Directorate of Extension Education, TANUVAS has planned to conduct six Zonal Workshops entitled "Field problems and solutions in veterinary and animal husbandry practices" covering all the districts of Tamil Nadu which serve as a platform to identify various region and area specific management and veterinary health care problems faced by the field veterinarians and provide suitable solutions.
