

MADRAS VETERINARY COLLEGE

The Madras Veterinary College (MVC), the first of the seven constituent Veterinary Colleges of TANUVAS, was started as an equine treatment school with five students in a temporary structure at Saidapet, Chennai in 1903. It is one of the oldest veterinary schools in the country. The college is located at Vepery near Chennai Central in nearly 6 ha. of land. The Madras Veterinary College is located in the prime area near the Jawaharlal Nehru Football stadium. It is well connected by train (Chennai Central/ Chennai Egmore), bus (Koyambedu and Kilambakkam) and airport (Meenambakkam International airport). Metro train, Local train and bus services are available from the airport and mofussil bus terminus to reach the conference venue. Weather at Chennai during July will be warm {with high of 90°F (32°C) and a low of 79°F (26°C) with occasional mild showers.

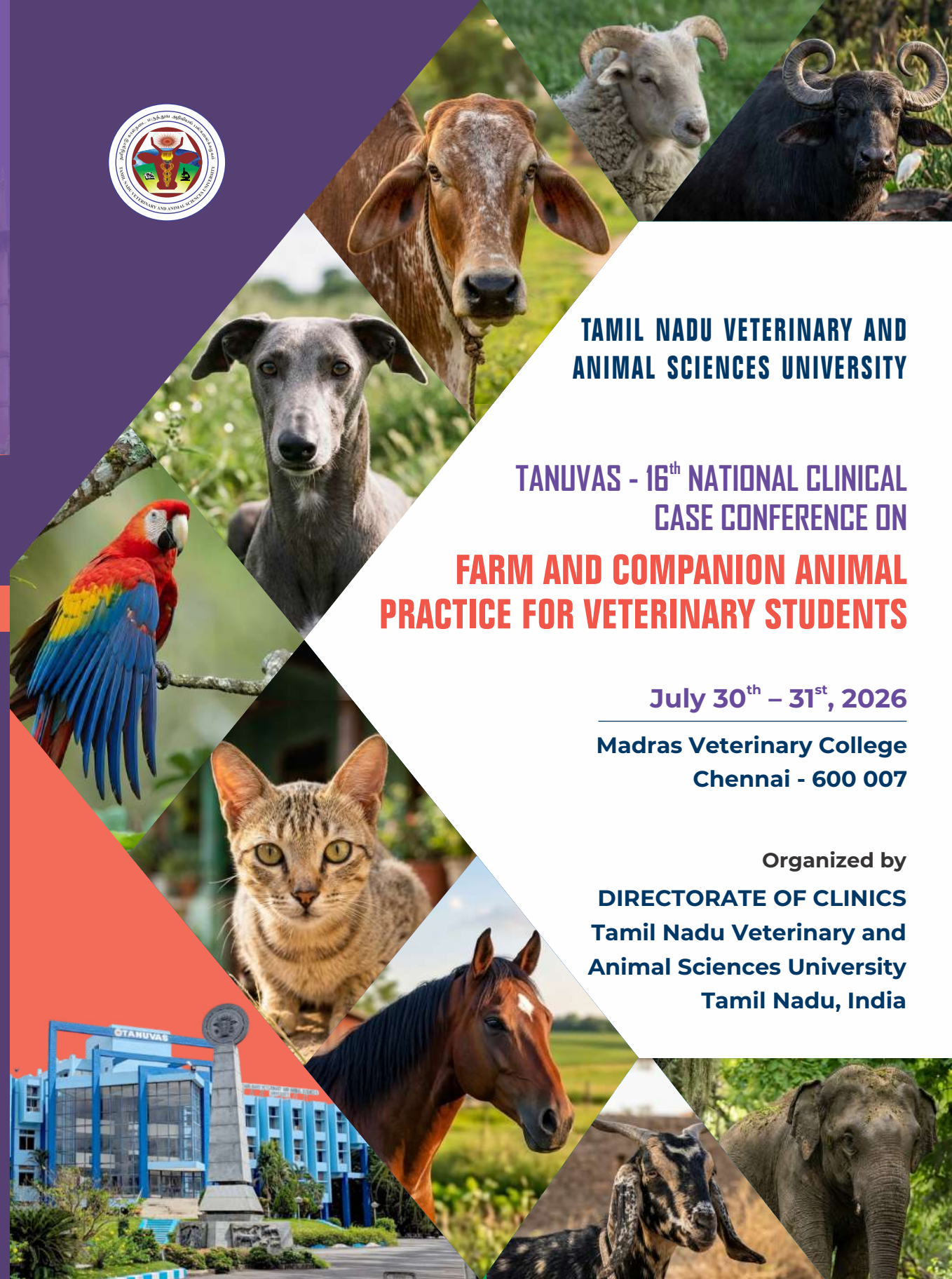

Participation as a delegate requires the submission of an online registration form along with the prescribed fee.

GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

Individual case studies (during the last one year as on 01.07.2026) of high quality in any discipline of clinical study including Medicine, Surgery and Obstetrics and Gynecology are invited. Abstracts duly certified by the Heads of the Departments (downloadable format available in the website) alone will be accepted. Students should attach the scanned copy of the duly signed certificate along with the abstract. **Abstract should be well organized and should not exceed 250 words.** The name, affiliation address and email id of presenting author (only one student) and faculty advisor(s) (max Four) should be provided. **Each student is eligible to present one abstract only.** The abstract submitted should not have been presented elsewhere. Abstracts accepted will be printed in the compendium of abstracts. **Abstracts should be submitted to the given e mail id on or before 20th July, 2026.**
